Future Success

The Juniata Valley Council has programs that are designed to prepare young people at every level for success as adults. Whether that involves Cub Scouts acquiring basic skills, Boy Scouts earning awards for lifesaving, or young men and women gaining outdoor skills in Venturing, Scouting provides worthwhile and lifelong benefits.

WHO WE SERVE

Over 1,670 young people grades K through the age of 20 Participate in Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, Venturing, and Exploring chartered to ninety community based Chartered Partners throughout Centre, Huntingdon, Juniata and Mifflin Counties. Our quality leadership and program is responsible for more than 80% of those Scouts retained for greater than one year.

PROGRAMS

2017 marked the 7th consecutive year the Juniata valley Council achieved the National Gold Journey to Excellence Award. We are one of only eleven councils nationally to achieve this award all seven years it has been presented. Our Seven Mountains Scout Camp continues to attract more Scouts, leaders, families and community organizations than ever before and continues to expanded new and better maintained facilities.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY & STEWARDSHIP

The Boy Scouts of America, through the principles of the Scout Oath and Scout Law, teach Scouts many key character attributes. Two of these are trustworthiness and thiri-fitness. These two points of the Scout Law are also applicable to the budgeting and financial responsibility of the Juniata Valley Council.

The 2016 Annual Operating Budget for the council was \$667,070 and is funded by many sources including the generous contributions of Scouting supporters (Friends of Scouting), product sales, camping events and activities, United Way, investment income, and other revenue.

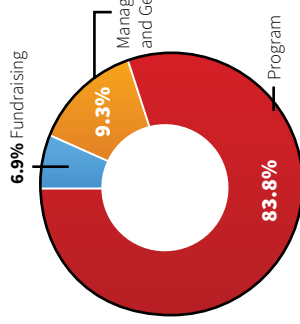
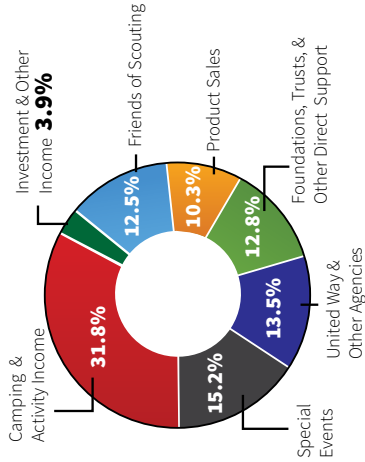
COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Operating Budget

The use of these resources is carefully managed through a volunteer developed, professionally managed budget. The Juniata Valley Council reinvests in young people with 83.8% of the annual operating budget being spent on Program Services. 9.3% was spent on management and general expenses and only 6.9% was spent on expenses related to fundraising.
